**Taiwan-Japan Friendship: Kaohsiung Branch Welcomes Faculty and Students from Sapporo Gakuin University and National University of Kaohsiung to Promote International Legal**

On December 10, 2025, the Kaohsiung Branch of the Administrative Enforcement Agency, Ministry of Justice (hereinafter referred to as "Kaohsiung Branch") warmly welcomed a delegation of 23 faculty members and students from the Department of Financial and Economic Law of National University of Kaohsiung and Japan's Sapporo Gakuin University. Through a series of activities including an on-site visit, discussion forum, mock movable property auction, and a guided tour of the branch's special exhibition titled *"Synergy of Prosecution and Enforcement – Files of Excellence"*, participants deepened their understanding of Taiwan's administrative enforcement system and strengthened cooperation in international legal education.

The event opened with bilingual (Chinese-English) hosting by Wu Chiao-Ju. Speeches were delivered in English and Japanese by Director Yang Pi-Ying of the Kaohsiung

Branch, Vice President Wu Hsing-Hao of National University of Kaohsiung, and Professor Huang Xin of Sapporo Gakuin University, reflecting the strong commitment on both sides to legal education exchange.

Enforcement Officer Chen Tien-Sheng gave a comprehensive enforcing briefing in Japanese, professionally introducing the operations of the Kaohsiung Branch, which was highly appreciated by the visiting academic community for the branch's international engagement.

One of the highlights of the day was the mock movable property auction, where Enforcement Officer Liu Chih-Ying used both Chinese and Japanese to explain the auction procedures. The featured auction item was a custom-made mascot doll named "Pai-Bao," specially designed by the Kaohsiung Branch. Students participated enthusiastically using symbolic tokens called "Pai-Bao Coins," and the highest bidder, Japanese student Matsumura, expressed great joy in winning the unique souvenir and bringing it back to Japan.

To conclude, Director Yang and Chief Enforcement Officer Wang, Shu-Wen led the delegation on a tour of the *"Synergy of Prosecution and Enforcement – Files of Excellence"* archival exhibition. With support from on-site explanations, Japanese audio guides, and bilingual (Chinese-Japanese) exhibition booklets, visitors gained a thorough

insight into the collaborative efforts between enforcement and prosecution systems in Taiwan.
